Who treads his findings with personal interest. We are interested in the personal digital archive, instead of the big collective collections. Our user is willing to add metadata to his findings, adding


to add metadata to his findings, adding his very own semantics so he can catalog and understand his own collection, perfectily clear and for its higher individual purposes.

He has a digital record collection which
he likes to dig around and listen to. He
also scrobbles his songs and gathers
additional info like last.fm



What/Why?



We want to look at people who seek specific data which has a personal intrested to them.

The what and why will be analysed in different personas eg. from the stamp-collector to the the sneakerfraker, from the movie freak to the nerd.

Where is the value of collecting digital data? We see printmedia as a timedocument. Imagine big art collections who are in the hands of private collectors, they remain historical visible because of being collecteted and selected in a subtle way. In 20 years a private digital collections could be valued like a time document or more a filter of the dynamic digital world. Reflecting the user in it's own way. The web is our new hunting ground.


We use artefacts for collecting. How is the common interaction with digital findings? e.g. pictures, music, websites.






What data is collected. What data

It's the users choice what data is collected and what data is of no interest or of low interest.




This is a principle in our concept.
